

The Department of Political Science at the Vrije Universiteit Brussel (VUB) seeks to hire a PhD researcher to work on a project on democratic innovations and democratic short-termism. The project is funded by the Research Foundation—Flanders FWO, and the candidate will become part of the research group on 'Democratic Innovations'.

The project

Modern democracies face many long-term policy challenges, including climate change, budget deficits, or nuclear waste disposal. Paradoxically, however, many authors claim that democratic systems are notoriously ill-equipped to deal with such long-term policy challenges. Democracies have an "appetite for the immediate" (Thompson 2011, p. 19) and experience difficulties in producing policies that take into account the long-term concerns of future generations. However, recent studies have shown that not all democracies are equally short-sighted. That is: some democracies are better at incorporating long-term considerations than others. The aim of this project is therefore (1) to clarify which democratic institutions exacerbate or alleviate democratic short-termism; and (2) to determine the potential of democratic innovations in overcoming democratic short-termism.

Your profile

- You have obtained a master's degree in political science or sociology (or equivalent) with excellent grades.
- Candidates that have not yet acquired their master's degree are equally invited to apply, but need to comply with all diploma requirements before starting their position at VUB.
- You have excellent language skills in English, written and oral.
- You have knowledge of quantitative and qualitative research methods and techniques, or you
 are prepared to acquire these methodological qualifications. Knowledge of experimental
 methods is an asset.
- You are expected to write a PhD dissertation under the supervision of professors Didier Caluwaerts and Kris Deschouwer.
- You are able to work harmoniously in a multicultural and multilingual environment.
- You are willing to travel regularly, to attend international conferences and summer schools, and to present your findings to international audiences.

Our offer

We offer employment as a full-time doctoral researcher.

Contract: full-time research grant for one year, renewable on an annual basis for a maximum of four years. Extension of the contract is subject to the agreement of the doctoral committee. Remuneration is at the level of a full-time research assistant at a Flemish university (approximately 1.900 euros net per month).
