CONTRIBUTION

The Graduate Student Network (GSN) should be student-friendly and low-cost, and not simply a junior version of ECPR and its traditional practices. For more effective academic exchange among us as well as for more opportunities for networking, we need more and longer GSN events. For this purpose, the GSN should find its own funding resources.
